We are in the process of reopening the office properly. Our office will remain closed to the public but we will have people in to answer calls soon! Please continue to use the temporary number until we release official "phone office hours" soon. Also, as of the first week of July we will discontinue the use of signups for Masses. The bishop's restriction of 25% capacity at each Mass remains in place so PLEASE be charitable and don't attend the 11am or 12:30pm every weekend but rather allow others to attend as well. Consider a Saturday 6pm or Sunday 8am Mass every other week to allow us all to attend what we'd consider our "normal" Mass time of the 11am and 12:30pm Masses. If we see that we're way over our numbers, we'll have to start back with the signups. All other precautions remain in place (ie. masks, social distancing). Thank you for your cooperation!

CALLED TO THE PERMANENT DIACONATE

The process of forming the next cohort of permanent deacons will begin soon. To be considered, an applicant must be a Roman Catholic man at least 35 years of age, an active member of his parish, and live within the diocese. He must be in good health, of sound moral character, mature faith, regular practice in the sacramental life of the Church, and have a sense of vocation to service. If married, he must be in a strong, valid, Catholic marriage for a minimum of five years and have the support of his wife and family. If unmarried, he must be willing and able to commit to celibacy. Applicants should be no older than in their early sixties. Those admitted should be prepared to commit themselves to the formation process for at least the next four years, beginning in the fall of 2021. Applicants should have a substantial history of active service to their parish, have the written approval of their pastor, and meet various other admission requirements. There are no special educational requirements.

The deadline for inquiries to the Diocesan Aspirancy Process is November 15, 2020. 


